Message from the Chairman

It is my pleasure to advise you that the Club has traded exceptionally well this financial year and our patronage has increased. To all of our Club employees, a sincere thankyou for a job well done especially during the months when the Club was being renovated.

At the 30th September 2015, our income of \$2,653,923 was up \$166,773, a rise of 6.7% on last year.

We currently have \$1,182,788 in our cheque/savings accounts and our total assets are \$1,899,911.

Our overall net profit of \$258,650 compared to \$272,685 last year, a fall of just \$14,034, was an exceptional result considering the Club upgrades and renovations that have now been completed and paid for.

This excellent result was brought about by careful planning and astute management of our extensive Club upgrades, renovations and ongoing maintenance program.

At the start of this financial year the Board carried out a Strategic Analysis of our local trading competition and developed our Club Business Plan. At the same time a very detailed inspection of the condition of our Club house, Club facilities, plant, equipment and external greens plant and equipment was carried out and from the information gained we drafted our Club Action Plan to ensure our proposed Club upgrades, renovations and maintenance program came in at budget.

Every member of the Board has worked very hard on your behalf throughout the year to achieve our aims. When you take into consideration the amount of tasks that have been successfully completed, the vast number of quotes that were sourced and the financial and individual project management that was needed to carry out this work, you can begin to understand the effort that was put in. All this was achieved with as little disruption as possible for our members and guests.

I would like to specifically thank Karen Gilfillan our Club Executive Manager for managing the numerous projects and Paul Hynes our Treasurer for overseeing our financial accounts.

As Chairman my main challenge for the year was to ensure the Club stayed abreast of our legal, statuary, constitutional and employee awards responsibilities. Many hours were spent researching our legal responsibilities and options and I can report that to the best of my knowledge, the Club is now complying with all of our statuary requirements.

As a pro-active Board with our primary aim to increase our Club membership and patronage the Board has at times made difficult decisions which have not pleased everyone but the decisions reached enabled us as a Board to achieve our aims.

On behalf of the Board of Management I trust that all our members and guests will enjoy our upgraded Club facilities. To our bowlers, please take the time to congratulate your Section Presidents Peter Hamilton and Barbara Ridgers for their leadership throughout the year.

A special thanks must also go out to our Green Keeper, Graeme Shillington and our Men's Games Director, Vince Sullivan for all of their hard work with repair and maintenance of our green's plant and equipment and our Club Maintenance Fitter Don Bode for his on call repairs.

Number 2 green has been laser levelled and regenerated and the ditch faces relined with rubber matting and will shortly be ready for use again.

Number I green will be out of service from mid November through to mid December having the ditch faces relined and the green regenerated.

In late October a massive short circuit followed by a fire within one of our light poles on number 1 green gave us cause to investigate the condition of all our light poles wiring, both within the light poles and also underground.

Unfortunately, the condition of the underground wiring between all of the light poles is unsatisfactory due to water ingress, bordering on being dangerous.

To this end, power has been cut off to the light poles and the underground wiring will be replaced as a matter of urgency during the last week in October on number 1 green followed by number 2 green during early November.

Bowling will continue on these greens in between the regeneration and during the underground rewiring program, and I ask all of our bowlers to be patient and above all, observe any safety instructions displayed.

If you have been following the Coaching Notes for the last couple of months and applying the ideas promoted, you should now have a good smooth, repeatable delivery and be ready to work harder to improve your drawing ability. Some time ago I wrote a 40 bowl training exercise for a club bowler to help him improve his overall game, it worked!! So with a few adjustments I am passing it along to hopefully improve your game, remember a game of bowls consists of about 90% draw shots with some variation to the draw. This self training program consists of 40 draw shots and is as follows:-

END 1 Jack on T mat at end of chalk line. Bowl 2 bowls forehand, 2 bowls backhand. Score 1 for each bowl within 1 mat length of jack.

END 2 Same set up and delivery in opposite direction.

END 3 Jack on T mat on T 4 bowls as before, same scoring.

END 4 Same set up as end 3

END 5 Place 1 jack 1 line away each side of centre line on T line, place mat on end of chalk line. Draw 1 bowl forehand and 1 bowl backhand to each jack. Score 1 for each bowl within 1 mat length of correct jack.

END 6 Same in opposite direction.

END 7 Same as end 5 but with mat on T.

END 8 Same as end 7 but in opposite direction.

END 9 Jack on T with a marker disc (old CD) placed in line 150mm(6 inches) to each side of jack, if you prefer you can place a bowl each side of the jack at about the same distance. Mat at end chalk line draw through markers to pick jack up and trail 1 metre through, or pass over disc. 1 bowl each hand. Move mat to max length and play 1 bowl each hand. 1 point for jack trail or passing over marker and stopping in end zone.

END 10 Place a jack marker beside bucket, mat on end chalk line, draw close to ditch without losing bowl. Move mat to max length and draw 2 more bowls. 1 point for each bowl within 1 mat length of front of ditch.

If this scoring appears too easy, substitute a mat width for the mat length and remember, anything outside that mat width(300mm) does not score.

Repeat this set of exercises once a week and observe your improvement, if there is no improvement you are not concentrating on the shot you are playing, and need to treat each shot as a game changer.

DIY Christmas card



What you will need:

Colored card stock in burgundy, light green print, dark green, beige, and medium green print
Stickers: alphabet or Christmas wording and ivy

Easy Nectarine Tarts



INGREDIENTS

•1 sheet frozen ready-rolled puff pastry

•1/4 cup light cream cheese spread

- •1 1/2 tablespoons raw sugar
- •Pinch of mixed spice
- •4 nectarines, halved, stones removed, sliced *See Note

Glitter
Scissors
Ruler
Tacky crafts glue
Decorative-edge scissors

METHOD

adies Lounge 🔏

1. Cut a 7-x-10-inch piece from burgundy card stock; fold to make a 5-x-7-inch card. Cut a 6-3/4-x-4-3/4-inch piece from light green; glue to front.

2. Cut a diamond shape from burgundy to fit card. Glue to dark green; trim. Glue on card. 3.Using decorative-edge scissors, cut a 4-1/4-x-2-1/4-inch piece from beige. Mount on burgundy; trim to a narrow border. Mount on medium green; trim. Glue on card. Use stickers to spell "Christmas Greeting" (or other sentiment) on the card front.

4. Dot glue around edges of card and in diamond. Sprinkle with glitter and let dry. Shake off excess.

METHOD

Step 1

Preheat oven to 200°C. Line a baking tray with non-stick baking paper. Cut pastry into 4 squares. Place onto prepared tray.

Step 2

Using a wooden spoon, beat together cream cheese, 1 tablespoon of sugar and mixed spice. Spread over pastry squares. Arrange nectarine slices over top.

Step 3 Bake for 12 minutes or until golden. Sprinkle with remaining sugar. Serve.

*Note Most fruits can be used in this recipe. Try apple or peaches for a variation.

Fruit tea



- •2 cups lemonade
- •2 peach and mango tea bags
- •2 cups boiling water
- •2 cups pineapple juice, chilled
- •1 cup orange juice, chilled
- •125g strawberries, hulled, finely diced

Step 1

Pour lemonade into a jug. Cover and freeze for 2 to 3 hours or until semi-frozen. Step 2 Place tea bags in a heatproof jug. Pour over boiling water. Brew for 5 minutes. Discard tea bags. Allow tea to cool. Step 3 Pour tea into large jug. Add pineapple juice, orange juice, semi-frozen lemonade and

strawberries. Serve.
