Message from the Chairman

Trading income for the year is up \$150,000, as at 22nd September 2015. Gaming is up significantly and bar trading is up. Our Green fees are down, primarily due to the loss of many rained out bowling days and our Wednesday and Friday night raffles are down slightly.

With the imminent opening of Club Burleigh in the Swell Complex the competition our bar, bistro and gaming departments will have to cope with have now gone up to another level. Burleigh CBD has now got more wine bars, take away food outlets, cafes, coffee lounges and restaurants than ever before.

Our Not for Profit status enables us to keep our liquor prices lower than our competitors, our gaming machine 'return to player percentages' higher than our competitors and our bistro menu and weekly specials at very reasonable prices. These advantages, coupled with our great customer service gives us every confidence moving forward.

A recent survey of our bistro patrons has revealed a startling fact that over 50% of our bistro patrons are neither, full bowling members or social members. Whilst we welcome this new patronage trend, which we put down to our advertising and our new Caterer Steve Paul, it beholds on every one of us to regularly patronise our club, thereby ensuring the continued viability of our bowls club.

In conjunction with the Club Executive Manager Karen Gilfillan, I have instigated a club maintenance program. The club now uses selected, tried and proven tradespersons to carry out our club maintenance and repairs. All our plant and equipment is monitored and where possible, preventative maintenance is performed on a regular basis to ensure we get the most cost effective benefit.

I am pleased to report that the 'free trivia' format has been reinstated with a couple of new initiatives. Free trivia is being conducted by Karen Fleming every Wednesday night from 7pm to 8.30pm and cash prizes in the form of cash 'in club vouchers' will be awarded to the winners of each round. A best team of the night cash 'in club voucher' is also awarded.

You may have noticed that Parking sensors have recently been inserted in the trial 'free parking area' at the top of the library car park. Greg Betts, Division 12 councillor has assured me that he has no intention of pushing for any changes to the current parking situation in the library carpark. The sensors are there to only monitor parking trends in the carpark.

Solar Report 📡

In response to queries raised by some of our members, I thought I would give a report on the performance of our PV (Photovoltaic) system.

The original system was installed 7.10.2012, as a 25kwh system. In November 2013, a further 15kwh was added. Our roof can accommodate about 40kwh of solar panels.

In arriving at the decision to install the solar panels, the Board of the time was faced with quite a large price increase of our electricity account for 2012 of \$53,404, plus further increases for a near future electricity consumption. If the Board had done nothing our electricity account for this year would have been some \$75,000. Our 2014 account amounted to a total of \$39,862. This is the combined expenses of admin, the bar, gaming and greens, as shown in the Annual report. By any standard, a very satisfactory result.

There have been other consumption reduction initiatives introduced since 2012. A VPO (Voltage performance optimiser) was installed to control the power fluctuations in the actual supply of power. 220 volts is the optimum supply. The bistro deep fryers were converted from electricity to gas, sky lights were installed, more energy efficient light globes were fitted to the bistro and lounge areas as well as more efficient air conditioning units, negotiate a new supply agreement. There are no meters, gauges or instruments on any of these alterations that would enable a performance check on individual items.

Coaching Notes by Ron



This month I would like to look at the mechanics of delivery and stress the importance of a smooth, relaxed and repeatable delivery action. So let us examine the points of the delivery which will ensure you are as smooth as your body will allow you to be. Firstly, your grip must be comfortable and sure, the bowl should be held in the finger tips to allow you to have a good feel for it's weight, but must not feel that it is going to fall out of your hand. The preferred grip by most coaches, and probably the majority of players, is the orthodox index and little fingers on the rings beside the running surface, with the thumb on, or just below, the ring. Just below the ring does remove pressure from the major joint of the thumb and is preferred by many players and coaches. The bowl must be held such that the rings are exactly vertical at delivery and the bowl must be pointing along your delivery line. Secondly, your stance on the mat should be such that you can stand with your body facing along the aiming line repeatedly. This is necessary because if the mat is moved up or back on the rink you don't have a fixed aiming line other than the one dictated by your angle to the centre line from your feet. If you wish to prove, this place the mat on the T and a jack on the other T. Draw a bowl to the jack, make a strong mental note of your anchor foot position on the mat, move the mat up to the 21m mark, place your foot in precisely the same place and deliver to the jack. You will find that, without reference to any other mark, you will draw the shot. Thirdly, be completely balanced on the mat, if you are not as you start your backswing, stop, stand, and restart your delivery swing. As you take the step forward, again if you don't feel balanced, stop, stand, and start again. Fourthly as you are swinging your arm into your backswing, make sure you lock your elbow and wrist at about the vertical and complete your back swing with a rigid arm and your delivery swing with the same rigidity of arm. Hold this position in the follow through, watch your bowl travel roughly a third of the way up the green before you come up going forward. Fifthly as you step forward make sure you are stepping straight ahead without bringing the toe of your stepping foot across your line as this will twist your body off your aiming line and produce a narrow backhand or a wide forehand delivery. Above all practice with an aim in mind, you may be having trouble with a particular shot, practice this shot repeatedly till you are comfortable playing it, but still practice the shots you play well. If you need help deciding on a training regime, talk to a coach who can help you develop the program which will suit your needs. Train your body and mind to produce a smooth delivery, free of jerking or stutters, have a pre-shot routine which relaxes you and allows you to deliver the bowl without any doubts in your mind about how to deliver. Remember the delivery is what you can control, the result is dependent on your ability to deliver smoothly. So ignore those things which you cannot control and deliver to the best of your ability.

CRAFT CORNER

DIY Ombre Vase



What you will need:

- •glass vase or bottle
- •high gloss acrylic paint in white and your chosen colour
- •plate or mixing tray
- •paint mixer or popsicle stick
- •1/2-3/4" flat, soft bristle paint brush

Instructions

.Step 1 Blend your paints in variegated shades of your chosen colour from light to dark as shown.



Step 2 Start by painting the top rim and top 1" of the vase with white paint. Try to keep the line as straight as possible.



Step 3 While paint is still wet, dip brush into second shade and

create a new stripe, slightly overlapping with the first stripe.



Step 4 Continue making darker and darker stripes all the way to the bottom of the vase. If you are doing more than one vase at a time, be sure to do each color stripe at the same time. Let dry completely.





Recipe Room

Prawn cocktails with smoky mayonnaise



Ingredients

- •1 1/4 cup (375g) whole-egg mayonnaise
- •1 1/2 teaspoons smoked paprika (pimenton) (see note), plus extra to sprinkle
- 3 teaspoons lemon juice
- •1 1/2 teaspoons smoked or regular sea salt
- •32 cooked prawns (about 1kg), peeled

- •2 avocados, 1cm cubes
- •2 tablespoons olive oil
- •1/3 iceberg lettuce, finely shredded
- •2 Lebanese cucumbers, peeled, halved, seeds removed, finely chopped
- •6 spring onions, thinly sliced on an angle

Method

Step 1. Combine the mayonnaise, smoked paprika, lemon juice and 1/2 teaspoon smoked or regular salt in a small bowl. Cover and chill until serving.

Step 2. Season prawns with the remaining salt and some pepper, then set aside.

Step 3. Toss avocado with olive oil and season with sea salt and black pepper. Set aside.

Step 4. Divide lettuce among 8 serving glasses. Top with avocado, cucumber and most of the spring onion. Arrange prawns on top and finish with a generous dollop of the smoky mayonnaise.

Step 5. Sprinkle prawns with remaining onion and some smoked paprika and serve.

Notes

Smoked paprika (pimenton) and smoked sea salt are available from delis and gourmet food shops.
