

Chairman's Report

To all our valued club members a very warm welcome back to the club. The last Bowler News was published at the end of March. On the 23rd March our club was forced to close due to the impact Covid-19 was having on the community. The club remained in lockdown until the 1st July, 13 weeks in total. During that period our Secretary Manager Justin and Bowls Co-ordinator Barrie produced mandatory CovidSafe plans for both the clubhouse and the greens in anticipation of a re-opening in addition to playing a co-ordinating role for a much needed internal refresh of the clubhouse. Many volunteers came forward and to those people a thank you for a job well done.

The work undertaken inside the club included:

- Painting of the ceiling including cleaning and painting of ceiling tiles
- Painting of all walls and columns including locker rooms
- Painting of the ceiling sculpture surrounding the poker machine area
- Removal of the old 'booth settee' near the Bistro
- All internal downlights changed to cool look LED

In addition tub chairs along the eastern windows were re-covered with a commercial grade cleanable material

Ladies lockers were repositioned and the remainder of the room was repainted with new carpet, new shelves and a new ceiling

The windows along the eastern side were serviced including new rollers to enable easy opening to take advantage of sea breezes when appropriate.

The enforced lockdown period did enable our greens and particularly the newly renovated green to have an extended rest period and they are certainly in top shape. Thank you to our greenkeeper Michael for your work and continued maintenance of the greens during our lockdown period. Unfortunately with the club finances the lockdown over 13 weeks with nil income did have an impact to our profit and loss and cash reserves in the bank. Prior to the lockdown the club had traded profitably with a healthy profit margin and looking forward to our usual busy time of the year with southern visitors. Refer to the Treasurer report in this edition for a further financial statement.

Subscription Fee Rebate. Advice has been received that Bowls QLD and GCTDBA are offering a discount on affiliation fees for part of this year due to Covid-19 closures. Bowls Australia have yet to advise a discount. At the time of writing this report calculations are being done to determine the amount of discount the club can offer full members.

The Board earlier in the year committed to upgrading both the internal and external look of the club. An architectural firm was contracted. The completed internal work followed the interior design recommendations with some work not completed due to financial constraints. Externally the plans include a repaint, new façade facing green 1, an upgraded entry and new signage. Plans will be on display in the entry foyer with work to commence at an agreed time after the next Board meeting.

Following an online linkup organised by our Bowls Co-ordinator Barrie with the CEO of Bowls Australia Neil Dalrymple and the Board the club has submitted an expression of interest to host the 2021 World Bowls Singles Championship to be held in October 2021.

It is anticipated subject to international travel issues some 50-60 countries will be represented and if our club is successful in the bid it will be a major achievement.

A members 'phonebook' will be produced this year for distribution to members. If you wish to have your phone number and email address if applicable to appear, please check with reception that they have the correct details.

The ability to pay by credit card/eftpos has been introduced to the games office together with social bowls prize money paid by way of 'points' on your members card. The points can be redeemed by purchases within the club including paying of mat fees and annual subscriptions. Thank you to members for acceptance of this change.

Due to covid-19 safe regulations communal areas such as the water cooler, coffee/tea urn, peanuts etc have been withdrawn. In addition, the club being environmentally friendly is moving to eliminate single use plastic items such as straws, plastic cups. Bowling members are encouraged to bring their own water container for filling at existing water stations. Insulated bottles with club logo are available to purchase. These actions are in line with proposed Queensland legislation on single use plastics due for implementation mid next year.

Let us all hope that we remain virus free and are able to continue bowling and socialising.

Treasurers Report

As mentioned in the Chairman's Report the covid-19 caused a club closure for 13 weeks. This closure just prior to our premium trading period of April to September and with continued border closures and travel restrictions, there has been a blow to our bottom line.

Prior to closure our profit to end of February was in the \$60,000's. During our closure all of the eligible staff were on Jobkeeper and the club received the Jobkeeper payment and the club also received the government cash flow boost subsidy. The club has ongoing fixed expenditure, e.g. rates, insurance, electricity, affiliation fees, audit fees, rubbish removal greens upkeep etc., which amounted to \$142,000 during the period of closure and this has reduced our cash on hand.

Even with all that has occurred, our year to date (Oct. to Jun.) trading profit and loss is (-\$14,000) which is \$40,000 better than the same period last year.

With the resumption of trading from 1 July, we will have additional trading costs to ensure we comply to the requirements of the covid-19 safety plans. We will be keeping a close watch on our ongoing expenditure and baring further hiccups due to the pandemic we are looking forward to a better final quarter.

Roll ups started on the first week of June and co-incidentally this was the first use of green #1. It is playing true and flat, a credit to Michael and his team!

July 1st was the return to club bowls with limited numbers on 2 great bowling surfaces. The north end of green #1 has been planted with Sir Walter buffalo grass as a trial to prevent couch mite migrating from the park to the green. The carpet green #3 has been double brushed with the brush mower. This leaves a desirable result without stripping the surface of thread.

The garden boxes are flowering well and will also be positioned along the southern wall of green #3.

The results of soil testing on green #1 came back with very positive numbers in most areas for ideal growth. The minor issues will be addressed when renovation occurs in late September, only spiking and leaf thinning, no core holes.

Both greens will be available for the summer months (November until February).


(No naming names of course!)
