### **Message from the Chairman**

Interesting, is a word that comes to mind describing my first month as Chairman. I would like to thank members and staff for their support. Special thanks to Jessica, Keira and our temporary lady Barbara, for their exceptional efforts in keeping the staff wages paid, bills paid and continuing to operate the club. On a positive note, this period has enabled me to gain a greater understanding of club processes and income streams. It is apparent that this club, along with many other small/medium size clubs particularly bowls clubs need to continue to explore other sources of income. The traditional income streams of bar and gaming are not sufficient to advance the club. The challenge is there to find other income sources for the current and any future Board.

I attended a Corporate Governance Workshop held by Clubs QLD during May. The workshop covered Board/Management interworking, Strategic Planning, Financial Reporting, Risk Assessment, Compliance, Culture, Ethics & Accountability. A great learning experience and a must do for all Board Members.

Thank you to Peter Hamilton for some great work on drafting a proposal on our car parking concerns. The proposal has been sent to the President of GCTDB who along with Bowls QLD is prepared to lobby the Gold Coast Council and State Government on our behalf.

An analytics report from our Burleigh Bowls Website has revealed for the last 10 months, 12,622 users have been on our site. That averages at over 40 per day. In terms of pages visited 'Home Page' was most visited at 35%, Bistro 9%, bowls/barefoot bowls 9%, What's on 8% and other pages. An on-going focus will be applied to social media as a means of promoting our club.

As a result of Brigitte picking up on a local visitor commenting that they did not know what went on at our club, we have undertaken a letterbox drop around the local area with 1,000 leaflets distributed to homes around Burleigh hill. Thank you Brigitte for folding all the flyers.

I have noticed many passing people perusing our A-frame boards at the entrance to the club. To further highlight our entertainment options a separate board has been placed on the wall which will be dedicated to entertainment. Our last rock & roll night was well patronised with our Bar Manager Garry particularly pleased with the takings. Keep an eye out for the next R&R night as the bands we are securing are top class.

The Board has implemented a Winter Barefoot Bowls policy. In addition to Sunday sessions, Saturday nights will be the only other night where Barefoot Bowls is played. Social membership of the club is now not required to play barefoot bowls as this requirement was placing additional strain on reception staff at the time of book-in and resulted in additional costs with minimal return visits to the club recorded. However, the club will continue to try such initiatives.

Plans for our 80th Birthday celebration on the 16/17th September are progressing. Michael Hart our State MP has accepted an invitation to the Sunday entertainment afternoon and the cutting of a cake ceremony.

Late News: I am informed that Jake Fehlberg has received 2 gold medals and a silver in the Blind Bowls National Championship. Well done Jake and Grant.

### **Coaching Notes by Ron**

Last month we dealt with the training programs that leads should use to prepare themselves to help their team win. This month we move on to the programs for seconds and other team members. Remember, we are training to win, not just training to compete. The difference being the level of commitment of each player in the team.

The thought uppermost in your mind at all times is that the most likely successful team will be the one that is most consistent and makes the least mistakes. The key word here is consistency. Bowls is a game of consistency not a game of correction. The greatest problem for the club bowler is consistency. How often do you see a player put down a good bowl and then, when the skip asks him to repeat the bowl and don't change anything, deliver a bowl that is meters shorter than the previous bowl and narrower? All members of the team should do the 40 bowl test at regular intervals to keep a record of their improvement, and to highlight their weaknesses on which they need to concentrate. While the seconds should be able to do all the programs set out for the lead, they also need some special training. A suitable drawing program for a second would involve the use of 4 jacks. The set up is, one jack on T, one jack on end of chalk line, place another jack a metre past the short jack and a

metre to the side, place the  $4^{tn}$  jack a metre short of the long jack a metre wide on the opposite side. The mat is always on the T and you draw on your backhand to the long jack first, then to the short jack on the center line, then to the long off center jack and lastly to the short off center jack. You score 3 points for a bowl a mat width from jack and 1 point for a mat length. This exercise is designed to allow you to concentrate on achieving best possible result with your first bowl at any target area. Retrieve your bowls, and repeat on forehand. the Remember you cannot gauge vour improvement if you don't keep your score.

Probably the most common shot a second must make is to draw to a hidden jack. To train for this shot place a bowl on the T with the jack about a metre in front of it , now place a second bowl on the center line about 200mm in front of the jack so that it cannot be seen from the mat, you are now 2 down and must draw second shot. Because this drill requires perfect shots only, bowls must be removed to negate the possibility of wicks. Again use a scoring system of 3 points for drawn shot, 1 point for second shot.

By this time I suppose 3rds and skips will be thinking, what about us. You need to have available in you repertoire all the above, perhaps not the jack rolling, but a lot more

besides. As a 3<sup>rd</sup> you will need to know how to respond if your skip says "disturb the head". If you haven't heard this before it implies that you should play into the head with the purpose of moving bowls or jack to make it possible for your second shot to be in the head or for the skip to be able to play a meaningful shot. The shot you play is only a metre or two over weight, you don't want to scatter the head or lose your bowl. Practice for this shot needs a full head of 8 or 9 bowls, so probably is best played as a team training run, it is a running shot so let it bend and target the bowl which will cause the shakeup you need. The skip must have every shot in the book and be able to play them any time. You will need a good rapport with your no 3 and trust his call of shot if you are uncertain from the mat, alternatively walk up to the head and see the shot required. Train yourself to play your conversion shots and your draw. More games are won with good drawing ability than good driving.

Remember practice must always be purposeful; a roll up without real purpose is not training.
