

Message from the Chairman

Club Air Conditioning

During the recent hot spell where daily temperatures at times reached above 36 degrees our two air conditioning systems could not maintain the desired 24 degrees temperature inside the club house.

We sought advice from our air conditioning maintenance company who then carried out a detailed inspection of the current efficiency of our two systems which revealed that both of our systems were working at 100%.

Our club house air conditioning was designed and engineered to handle a maximum of 32.5 degrees outside air temperature and cope with a differential of 10 degrees between the outside air temperature to the temperature inside the club house (as per the Gold Coast regional standard). However, when the outside temperature soared up to 36 degrees the best our two systems could do was to maintain the club inside temperature to about 26 degrees.

Unfortunately, the constant opening and closing of our club entrance doors exacerbated the problem by allowing the slightly higher internal cool air pressure in the club house to escape thereby permitting hot air to flow in.

Our air conditioning maintenance company recommended we seek the advice of an air conditioning engineer to come up with a solution,

however we were also advised that this recent heat wave was a 1 in a 100 year event.

We are waiting for the air conditioning engineer's report and have been advised that it would be possible to install a 'rapid booster system' in

addition to our existing two systems that would automatically activate when the inside temperature exceeded 27 degrees and 'inject' a large amount of cold air into the club. However these 'rapid boosters' come at considerable cost and in consideration that this latest heat wave was a 1 in a 100 year event the club may decide that at this point in time the cost is not justified.

I will keep you informed of this matter.

Dogs

The Club, acting on legal advice, has been compelled to ban dogs from our club, other than those dogs that are fully accredited registered

disability assistance dogs, in order to provide a duty of care to all of our bowlers and patrons and to remove the risk of legal exposure and liability to our club.

Coaching Notes by Ron

The control of weight and the ability to visualise the path of your bowl are probably the most important points in playing good, consistent bowls. As a new bowler you had so many thoughts racing through your head to ensure your delivery was smooth and repeatable, that your weight control was somewhat hit and miss. Once you have developed your delivery to the point where you really don't think about its mechanics, you will need to train your muscles and senses to deliver correct weight. Most players were taught weight control initially be control of arm speed or from the elevation theory, the higher the start point the longer and faster the swing. However your body has inbuilt sensors and a rather powerful computer called a brain, train the brain to compute speed.

Elite bowlers prepare for delivery by visualising the path of the bowl and the bowl finishing its run exactly where required. They develop a "feel" for the delivery from the weight of the bowl, their perceptions of the pace of the green and senses in their bowling arm and shoulder. This takes a lot of practice and concentration on the "feel" of a delivery. Such rehearsal provides a mental pattern for their largely automatic delivery movement to produce the bowl speed required. They use hand and eye coordination for intuitively integrating gravity forces with muscular force in executing the movement. A corrective delivery for a bowl finishing 1 metre short of its target requires only 2 - 1/2 more revolution of the bowl to be perfect. You need to make this slight variation by "sensing" the extra bowl speed rather than deliberately deciding to change your delivery mode.

You should have trained your body to produce this result, so let your sub-conscious mind do its job without interference from you.

You will need to be able to visualise the path travelled by your bowl in the run to the jack to be able to play trail and other through the head shots. Bowl a bowl to the jack, walk up its track and place some form of the markers on this line, go back to the mat and draw another bowl, chase it to the jack and observe how far out your imagined track was from reality. You will probably have imagined that you saw your bowl turn in much later and more steeply angled to the centre line than actually happened. This observation will allow you to correct your visualisation of your bowl's track and allow you to make small width adjustments to draw into and through the head.

When delivering the bowl focus your whole being on the process of delivery, have a pre delivery routine, say, step onto the mat knowing what you want to achieve, take a deep breath to relax your shoulder muscles, check the bowl is on the correct hand, breath in on the back swing and exhale on the delivery. This routine will help focus on what you are doing, not on what you hope will happen. Then you begin to follow the bowls track and observe its fate, don't stop watching until the bowl stops, did you do what you intended or not, whichever way it went, learn from the delivery.
