#### **Financial Report**

#### **Half year Financial Report**

Unfortunately, not a good report.

Our Trading result for the year to date shows a net loss of \$61,425 compare to a net profit of \$59,957 for the year previous.

Why? Less patronage, higher expenses, declining membership, less bowlers, expensive repairs/maintenance, higher gaming payouts, declining return from our Raffles, Sponsorship hard to find, higher electricity (failed invertor—warranty claim pending) lack of greenspace restricting our Barefoot numbers. Bar sales are down marginally, Gaming patronage down, Greens income are down. On the other side we have increased advertising in an attempt to attract more patronage, provision for Gaming points, increased costs of green maintenance, provision for "Card It" increased Link Jackpots, provision for RDO's, additional provision for LSL.

Overall, our income for the period is down \$80,407

Expenses \$35,961

For net Trading Loss of \$61,425

Admin earnings are down \$5,014

To maintain our Club in operation we are making up the shortfall from our accumulated cash reserves.

There is no extravagant expenditure. Our spending is confined to those items necessary for the maintenance and operation of our Club. Capital works are on hold in the meantime.

#### **PROSPECTS**

We urgently need a good winter trading period. When it is known that at 31/3/16 our net profit was \$59,957 and at 30/9/16, \$97,742 (or \$37,785 for the second half of last year) if that is the best that we can do, then for the end of this year we are looking at a "red" balance. This shortfall will have to be made up from our accumulated cash reserves.

#### **Coaching Notes by Ron**

With the pennant season due to begin in a few months, now is the time to begin some serious training in preparation to representing your club to the best of your ability. I would like to ask if you are "Training to Compete" or are "Training to Win"? Training to COMPETE requires the bowler to be a contributor, but training to WIN requires total commitment by the athlete. The bowler who is training to compete will attend some training sessions and have the occasional rollup, however the bowler training to win will devote more time to playing drills designed for the position in which they will be playing. For example, how many leads practice delivering the jack? This is the most important part of the training for the lead position and the lead should spend some part of every session practicing his/her jack delivery technique. Unfortunately the idea that the lead position is where you put your weakest player is still prevalent in many clubs. In any game, the lead must be your most consistent draw bowler. If your lead is wayward you will consistently be playing catch-up bowls. Remember the team most likely to win is not the one that plays the most brilliant shots but the one that makes the least mistakes. So how can a lead become proficient at his/her work? Firstly they should become proficient at delivering the jack over all distances, you should be able to place the jack within a mat length of the position indicated by your skip. At training you should deliver to a target, perhaps one of you own bowls, and keep a record of you margins to determine improvement. You should regularly do a 40 bowl test which records scores of bowls within a mat length of the jack. You should not accept a result less than 28 bowls (40%) as being an acceptable result. If you are to be proficient at your task at least 14 bowls (70% of 20)

should be the first bowl you deliver. The higher the percentage of first bowls drawn to the jack, the greater chance of having first shot. To increase the number of first shots you need to practice with two bowls and two jacks place at different lengths, drawing anly one bowl to each jack. If you are intent on improving your drawing ability, any bowl not drawn within the designated area should be retrieved and redrawn. Do this often enough and you will concentrate on your shot much harder. One metre is suggested as the minimum acceptable distance for a new lead but you must aim for improvement to a maximum of 600mm (a mat length). All leads, regardless of experience and level of play, should practice drawing to a hidden jack, as should all members of the team, as this shot occurs more frequently in a game than any other. The way for a lead to get practice at this shot is to, either set up a head with a hidden jack, or to play two-bowl singles with another lead. When two leads play two-bowl singles your objective should be to get the shot, but if not, make sure you get second shot, never go down two. This applies particularly if your opponent has a resting toucher or a close bowl hiding the jack. Remember that a jack high bowl is not a very safe shot and a short bowl will only interfere with a later member of the team being able to move the shot and jack, a little behind, sa up to a metre is a good delivery in this case. Next month I will give you some training suggestions for the other members of the team.
