

Chairman's Report By Paul Hynes

It has now been 3 months since the club re-opened on the 1st July after the forced closure. There have been changes brought on by the CovidSafe plan the club has operated under, most notably:

- Restrictions on the number of patrons allowed inside the club. You may have noticed our staff wearing a yellow vest patrolling the club counting patrons.
- A lot less furniture is on the ground. A quantity of tables and chairs are in storage. Personally, I think the club looks a lot more open and uncluttered with less furniture.
- The communal coffee and tea has disappeared together with plastic cups. The club is going plastic free as mentioned in the last newsletter. Bowlers are reminded that with the weather warming up simply put a water bottle or even a cup in your bag and fill from the water stations. Glasses are available from the bar if need be.
- The move to cashless is expanding with more members using credit cards and points on their membership cards to purchase items.

Members are reminded that subscription fees are required to be paid by the end of October to remain financial. Payments made after that date will be at the full fee excluding the discount offered to members this year due to the club closure. At reception please see that the club is holding the correct address, phone and email details for you. The Club AGM this year will continue with the following restriction if there are no changes to State Government or Commonwealth policy. There will be a limit of 120 members who can attend. First in applies. Proxy voting in line with our constitution still applies. Whilst the Office of Fair Trading has granted an additional 6 months in which to hold AGM's (in total 12 months after the end of our reporting season) the Board maintains for continuity the AGM should go ahead as normal but with capped attendance. Please note due to CovidSafe there will be no drink vouchers this year. The timeline is:

- AGM Sunday 29th November. 9.30 am
- Notice of AGM meeting posted by Saturday 7th November setting out the meeting agenda and any *notices of motion received*
- Nominations for Board positions. Called from Sunday 1st November.
 Close 5pm Saturday 14th November.

Club Finances. The treasurer Phil will expand in his report however given the extreme circumstances during the year members should be pleased with the expected profit that our figures are showing (subject to end of financial year auditing). Many other clubs would be delighted to be in such a position.

Meetings with the local state MP Michael Hart and the local councillor Daphne McDonald were held during the last month. Michael provided a letter of support for an initiative regarding a coffee outlet and bar in part of our green shed which required approval to proceed by the State Government. The meeting with Daphne revolved around parking issues with the light rail stage 3 which are not settled yet and the Burleigh Heads Community Master plan which this club is very much a part of.

The club has a redesigned website. The new website makes it easier for us to provide quicker and more up to date information on club activities.

Washed Out Days. Section Presidents have agreed that 5 ends constitutes a game. For less than 5 ends mat fees will be refunded. If paid by cash or Credit Card a cash refund will be given by the games office. If points on members cards were used for payment the points will be re-instated at reception.

Building Works. The Board has approved expenditure up to \$100,000 on an external refresh to the clubhouse. Works will include painting the whole of building, a new south facing facade, new signage, upgraded front entry and other enhancements. Work is due to commence on the 19th October and expected to take 6 weeks. In addition due to the popularity of the area alongside the greenkeeper shed during last years Queensland Premier League series part of the shed will be converted for dual use as a coffee outlet in the mornings and an outside bar when appropriate at other times. Outdoor seating and umbrellas will complete the scene which will be landscaped. The coffee outlet will be run by an outside contractor. Negotiation with the State Government as owners of the land has been ongoing for some time on this proposal.

The Bowling side of the club has generated great enthusiasm with the initiative of live streaming some of the finals of the mens section notably the pairs and singles. The streaming watched by enthusiasts from all over the world. Special mention to our Bowls Co-ordinator Barrie who put on a wonderful display to win the District Champion of Champions single final. The zone final is the next step for Barrie.

I hope to see as many members as possible at our AGM.

This has not occurred since 2015. With future undertakings in the planning stages the club should further increase its bottom line without further unforeseen events.

Green's Supervisor Report By Ossie Moore

The donated green carpet, which lay on green #3 for some weeks, has been laid on the eastern side of green #2. The remainder is currently earmark for a similar laying after this trial is examined. Green #1 is now in a renovation phase.

There was an AIR injection machine performing sub-level air blasts to loosen soil and root matter. This allows oxygen and nutrients to filter deeper into the profile of the soil. Monday, the 14th Sept the entire grass surface was subjected to verti cutting, which thins the thatch of grass on removes the tiffdwarf runners. There will be calcium added and the slightly low PH levels will be raised. There was a low sodium reading in the last test, which means the bore water is suitable to use without any adjustments. Also a deep spike machine will open up the top surface after the cutting.

Green #2 is healthy and will be in major use during this period. It will be in play until next year, before renovations commence. The synthetic green #3 will be the overflow green, if needed.

Michael made comment at the Sept board meeting, that he is very happy with the progress of green #1, and that a topdressing of this green will depend on a closer inspection after treatment. He sets high standards and this is reflected in the quality of the bowling surfaces.

Donna Jenkins team prevailed winning 26-10.Well done to both Teams and congratulations to the winners.




