

## Chairman's Report By Paul Hynes

#### A REPORT FROM THE CHAIRMAN

To members and visitors to the club, I would like to express my thank you for your overwhelming acceptance of the lockdowns and restrictions that have been placed on us all due to the ongoing covid delta situation. Over the last 2 months 11 days of lockdown have occurred with restrictions on the number of people in the club, a ban on dancing and the wearing of masks for much of the time mandatory. Well done everyone.

**Subscriptions.** A reminder that subscriptions are due by the end of September. The amount payable is \$138 for all adult members. The Treasurer tabled a fee increase at the 2019 AGM explaining our fees are below most other clubs and after association affiliation fees are deducted the amount coming to the club is around \$50 per member, quite reasonable. Due to covid and club closures for 13 weeks during 2020 affiliation fees for clubs were discounted and we were able to pass on the discount for the 2020 year.

**Points on Member Cards.** Credits on member cards should be cleared by the end of September with the exception of gaming machine money. Credits may be used to pay subscriptions, mat fees and the purchase of goods in the club.

**Qld Government Community Achievement Award**. The club has been nominated by a community member for recognition as a 'sporting club making a difference in the community'. We have prepared a submission to be in the running with the finalists and winner announced in late September. Our submission included a history of the club, our role in building strong, vibrant and healthy communities, short and long term goals, barriers and obstacles faced and a summary of achievements and impacts. Thank you to club manager Justin and bowls co-ordinator Barrie for the time you have spent with the local marketing company Lemontree in establishing options on a fresh new logo for our club incorporating a corporate logo for use on all company marketing and communications. Various logo options were presented to the Board for discussion, revision, further revision and eventually acceptance of a

standout option. A new uniform design incorporating the new logo is being co-ordinated by the Bowls Committee. The new logo and uniform will be presented at a members function at a time to be advised.

Race Day. Members enjoyed a day at the Gold Coast Turf club on the August Friday showday holiday. Breakfast at our club, bus to and from, entry to a reserved location in the members area, lunch provided with games throughout the day contributing to a fun day enjoyed by all. Our club sponsored race 1 on the day the 'Burleigh Bowls Maiden' for very little outlay and in return we were provided with the naming rights for the race, advert in the form guide, a 30 second promotion by the course announcer and our attendance at the trophy presentation to the winner of the race. Thank you Justin and Kiri for organising the day and to Aaron for his help.



At the time of writing Michael is in lockdown in NSW (Kingscliff). Ian Mitchell has taken the lead role under Michael's instructions, in general. The greens have improved since the last Bowler News, after using sprays to control algae and the application of some fertiliser.

Air injection was done in mid August, just before the lockout. A product with dye indicator was applied to green #1, which seemed to show some noticeable improvement in grass growth. Renovation of green #1 is due now, however Michael is unable to cross the border. Ian and Scott Franklin, working in tandem will complete this, if there is no change to border permits. This green should be out for 8 weeks. There are a couple of issues, include sand sourcing because of the border issues. Also, in this time frame a nursery will be planted behind green #1, with the Sir Walter grass being transferred to the coffee shop precinct.

#2 green is in decent shape heading into this period.


Both mowers have had needed maintenance, off site, and are ready for Summer.


