



Chairman's Report

A REPORT FROM THE CHAIRMAN

The new year has produced changing circumstances for the club. From a very busy pre-Christmas trading period, post-Christmas has seen a significant downturn in our trading. The main cause being the Omicron variant spreading in the community combined with the Government vaccination mandate which has affected many members including staff and kept many people significantly barefoot bowlers away from the club. It was necessary to cancel Australia Day social activities due to potential problems in policing the restrictions. The club was forced to close for 2 days during January due to staff being impacted.

Since the club AGM 2 meetings of the Board have been held with the following sub committees being formed:

Finance chaired by Phil Westlake

House & Infrastructure chaired by Di Pickett

Bowls Committee chaired by Scott Franklin

Initiatives for this year and following years have been identified. For the bad news the price of drinks have increased due to excise and transportation increases. It should be noted no increase was made last year as a result of stop/start covid situations. A comparison to nearby hospitality venues indicates we still have in the main the cheapest drinks in the area.

New shirts are still arriving in batches and every full bowling member at the end of October 2021 is entitled to a free shirt. In the main the shirt design has been well received however as expected you cannot please everyone. Designs for caps, hats, jackets, vests are progressing.

The replacement of the surface for green 3 is expected, weather Permitting, to commence late April/May. This is a significant job and will take 6-8 weeks. The process involves removing 50mm of the current under surface, level and compact a crushed rock base, cover with woven geotextile fabric, install panels to protect the under surface and improve drainage, install the synthetic grass over the panels, install a concrete plinth to the green. As testimony to the popularity of this surface the distributing and installing business KCL is booked out for the next 12 months. We were lucky to be able to be slotted in.

The club has engaged a Business Consultant with extensive experience to facilitate workshops aimed at developing a 5 year strategic business plan for the club. The time is right with the light rail outside our door possibly 2-3 years away and the stretch to our capacity which occurs at various times of the year to look 5 years into the future and plan accordingly. Possibilities such as synthetic main greens under a roof and possible extensions need to be planned now. Large Government Grants and if required bank loans are more favourably looked at if a Business Plan is in place. Please discuss with any Board member your thoughts on the future of the club which can be represented at the workshops. The plan will take approximately 3 months to compile.

Infrastructure improvements for the year have been identified by the House Committee, being:

- The small green re-surface
- Mens restroom upgrade. Quotes are being received for this upgrade made necessary by leaking pipework under tiling
- Our Waterdragon and Corporate logos incorporated into the facia fronting the main green

- Advertising board at the front entrance
- Additional matching shed next to the existing greenkeeper shed
- Gaming room change by moving the wall separating the bistro outwards to accommodate additional machines in the future

Planning for the clubs 85th Birthday celebrations in September will start soon with Brian Bottrell leading a small committee.

On a sad note, unfortunately the club lost a stalwart and much loved member during January. RIP Geoff ‘Critta” Crittenden. You will be missed.

Good bowling and keep hydrated during the warmer weather.


As always we are looking for more coaches and umpires if you are interested in registering please see myself or reception.

Green #1 continues to play true and was well prepared for the Max Morris and Premier League competitions, given the weather conditions. There was continued treatment for algae, and minor aeration was done to assist with root development. The gutters were replenished with brilliant white sand.

Green #2 managed to survive December and make renovations in early January. The surface was scarified and later, with the help of a working bee, top-dressed to allow the “levelling tractor” to perform. The worn areas were spiked with a roller and the green will be top-dressed again on Thursday 10th of February. Soil amendments and fertiliser were added prior to Thursday.

Green #3 had the sweep mower run over the surface each week and the Club/ Board has signed off on the KCL company to resurface and panel the green. This process will require 6-8 weeks and will proceed shortly after #2 is back in play.

Again, thanks to all in the working bee and Michael and his team for their continued work ethics over this period.

Ladies Games Director Report


